
It's therefore a propitious time to draw

The Seminar will provide insights about the need for teaching and practicing ethics in higher education, with reference to the Public Universities Acts of different States, UGC code of Professional Ethics, the impact of value education and ethical training in institutions of higher learning and unethical issues in institutions of higher-learning, as well as the manner in which they are being/have been handled or neglected, from various perspectives.

Submission of Abstracts:

Interested candidates should submit the abstracts of their papers in 300 words latest by 15 Jan. 2019. However the interested candidates are advised to rush their abstracts at their earliest because when the required number of abstracts are approved, it's likely that the remaining abstracts will be rejected.

Criteria for Consideration of Papers:

The papers should meet the following criteria

- the material should be original;

- the methodology used should be standard and appropriate;
- results should be explicit and supported with data/photographs/ and other evidences;
- conclusions should be realistic and based on the findings;
- the topic should be of educational interest and findings should have practical significance.
- Papers involving human and animals should be ethically cleared by the concerned ethical committees.

Participation Eligibility:

Teachers, academic leaders, and research scholars (M.Phil and Ph.D. Students) from higher academic institutions across the country.

Participants' TA/DA:

Only 40 presenters and 40 participants will be accepted on First-Come-First-Served basis. Provision of T.A./D.A. for the paper presenters and participants will be as per the UGC norms. As the number of available seats for the Seminar is limited, please apply at the earliest.

The Academy Campus is situated at Shivaji Nagar, Panchgani, a peaceful hill resort of the Western Ghats—Sahyadri Mountain Range, about 4300 feet above mean sea level, 106 Kilometers south of Pune, in the State of Maharashtra, India. Its 'Permanent Seat' overlooks a scenic valley and mountain range with farm land terraces. It is surrounded by trees and gardens that are favourite of the visiting peacocks, birds of different species, rabbits and at times deers. The Campus is not far from spots that are frequently visited by the tourist – the Table Land, Parsi Point, Sidney Point, and a few kilometers away from Rajpure Caves. Panchgani is 19 Kilometers from Mahabaleshwar Hill Station.
